NEW SET UP 2026 — ROAD TO THE WORLD TOUR

In 2026, the Street League format goes next level. The concept is simple and powerful: win your district and instantly secure your ticket to the finals during the 3x3 Unites Festival in Amsterdam, where Street League and the FIBA 3x3 World Tour come together at one epic location. This year we play in **21 districts**, each with **3 stops**. Collect your points, claim the #1 spot, and earn your place on the biggest 3x3 stage in the Netherlands.

The Setup

Each city/district organizes 3 qualification stops spread across three weekends. 21 districts, 3 chances per district.

IMPORTANT:

You stay in your district!! So you cannot 'city hop'.

The Reward

The winners per city (per category) qualify directly for the Street League Finals during the World Tour weekend.

There you will play against the other winners from each district for the SL title!

18+ finalists play IN the stadium.

Finals Location

NDSM-werf, Amsterdam. Center Court and Side Courts — playing among the pros of the World Tour and Women Series.

Sign Up

Via the official 3X3 Player Hub. All teams must register to track points and rankings.

The theme "From the Street to the Top" is not just a slogan, it's a route. From your own neighborhood, your court, your crew, to the biggest 3x3 festival in the Netherlands. This is your chance to show what you're made of.

Every stop counts. Every point counts. Every game is one step closer to Amsterdam.



CATEGORIES 2026

There will be competition in **7 categories**. Teams consist of a minimum of 3 to a maximum of 6 players who may rotate throughout the entire competition — but per stop, a maximum of **4 players** may be active. The captain determines the lineup per stop.



U13 Mixed

Open to boys and girls up to 13 years old. Mixed teams, maximum energy at the smallest scale.



U15 Girls & U15 Boys

Two separate categories for players up to 15 years old. Sharp competition, great development.



U18 Girls & U18 Boys

The Next Gen. Players up to 18 years old who show that the future is now. On Friday, June 19, they will be at the Finals.



18+ Women & 18+ Men

The open category. From street legends to serious competitive players — everyone is welcome at this level.



BIRTH YEAR REQUIREMENTS

U13 MIXED

Born in **2013 or later**

Max. age: 12 on January 1, 2026

U15 GIRLS & U15 BOYS

Born in **2011 or later**

Max. age: 14 on January 1, 2026

U18 GIRLS & U18 BOYS

Born in **2008 or later**

Max. age: 17 on January 1, 2026

18+ WOMEN & 18+ MEN

Born in **2007 or earlier**

Min. age: 18 on January 1, 2026



Teams consist of min. 3 and max. 6 players. Per stop, a maximum of 4 players may be active. Each player may only play for one team throughout the entire competition.

RABO 3X3 STREET LEAGUE — DISTRICT GUIDE

Earn points in your district to qualify for the Rabo 3x3 Street League Finals. To score as many points as possible, play as many stops as you can in the district you registered for. Pay close attention to where you can play — because the goal is to secure your spot at the Street League Finals at NDSM Wharf, Amsterdam on June 19, 20 & 21.

FIXED LOCATION DISTRICTS

 These districts play all 3 stops at the same location — easy and consistent.

AMSTERDAM OOST

Girls Only event on June 13 @ Makassarplein

LEIDEN & CO

U13 Mixed, U15 Boys/Girls & +15 Boys/Girls play in Katwijk.
U18 Boys/Girls & 18+ Boys/Women play in Leiden.

VLISSINGEN

Starts early — first stop is in the weekend of May 16–17.

ZWOLLE

Plays only in the weekend of May 16–17. Winners qualify directly for the Finals at NDSM Wharf. Runners-up may re-register in another district for another shot at the Finals.

ORGANIZATION ON SITE

Each host city is run by a **local street league captain** and a team of **3X3 Leaders**. You are the face of the Street League in your city. Ensure smooth execution, a great atmosphere, and maximum visibility. Leaders always wear the official 3X3 Unites gear.

MATERIALS PACKAGE

Hardware: Beach flags, banners, tents, scoreboards.

Game kit: Whistles, first aid kit, match forms.

Prizes: Medals for the winners of the local League after round 3.

Branding: Leaders in 3X3 Unites gear!

Content: Coordinate with Marcom captain Shuwendly.

Leader Tasks

1

Field setup

Partner visibility through flags and banners in the right positions.

2

Registration

Check-in via the Airtable/Player Hub integration. ID check required.

3

Match supervision

Support matches according to FIBA 3X3 rules with a focus on Fair Play.

4

Create content

Photos and videos for the local community pages. Team photos, highlights, winners.

COMPETITION & RANKING SYSTEM

The Street League is a **points system across 3 stops**. All three stops count toward the final ranking. The team with the most points after three stops wins the district and advances to Amsterdam. Consistency wins here — one bad day is no reason to give up, but don't leave any points on the table.

1st Place

Maximum points per stop for the winner

80

2nd Place

Points for the runner-up per stop

70

3rd Place

Points for third place per stop

3

Stops Count

All three stops count toward the final standings

Tiebreakers

1. Head-to-head result
2. Point differential across all stops

No-Show Rule

A no-show results in an **automatic loss**. Make sure the captain confirms attendance no later than **1 hour before the event day** via the Player Hub.

Additional point scoring:

4th place = 60, 5th place = 50, 6th = 40, 7th = 30, 8th = 20, 9th = 10. Anything below that is 0 points

MATCH RULES & FORMAT

All matches are played according to the official **FIBA 3x3 rules**. Below are the most important game rules for the Street League 2026. Communicate these rules **always in advance** to all participating players and teams — especially if you use adjusted times due to too many teams or too few baskets.

Match Duration

10 minutes or until 21 points. Adjusted time possible with many teams or too few baskets — communicate in advance!

Scoring

1 point inside the 2-point line. 2 points outside the 2-point line. Simple, fast, effective.

Shot Clock

12-second shot clock (if applicable at the location).

Overtime

In case of a tie: overtime. First to 2 points wins. No mercy, no excuses.


Break

Break between matches: approximately 2 minutes. Keep the schedule tight so everything runs on time.

Fair Play

Matches are played without a referee. Players call their own fouls. Play fair, respect your opponents.

*if you are unsure whether players can handle this themselves, you may always use referees! Decision lies with the Lokal Captain.


 Protests are always submitted via the event lead on site. Decisions made by the event lead are final.

→ CHECK-IN & REGISTRATION

A smooth check-in is the basis of a good event. Make sure all teams arrive on time and that registration via the Player Hub is completed correctly. No check-in means no participation — it's as simple as that. The local Street League captain and leaders ensure this process runs smoothly.

STREET LEAGUE FINALS — NDSM WHARF AMSTERDAM

This is what it's all about. The **Street League Finals** take place at the iconic NDSM Wharf in Amsterdam — the stage for the FIBA 3x3 World Tour Masters. Finalists play alongside the pros of the World Tour and Women Series. There are **4 basketball courts** available on site. The schedule will be available no later than **one week before the start**, and finalists will receive a personal invitation.



📍 Location: NDSM Plein 90, Amsterdam. Finalists will be personally invited via phone and/or email on 8 June.



FINALS PRIZES

The winners of the Street League Finals won't go home empty-handed. We're providing prizes that match the level of the stage — because if you win the Street League, you deserve recognition that reflects it. More partner prizes will follow later (TBD).



Exclusive Clothing Package

All finalists receive an exclusive clothing package. Dress like a champion, look like a champion.



Official Street League Trophy

The real deal. The official Street League Trophy — proof that you are the best in your district.



Wildcards NL Tour Finals

Wildcards for the 3X3 NL Tour Finals Amsterdam on 25/26 July for all finalists at our 3X3 Festival on the NDSM. From the Street League Finals straight through to the next challenge.

EXTRA PERK — WORLD TOUR ACCESS



 Street League finalists get free entry to the FIBA 3x3 World Tour games!

Finalists are seated in **Section G** (free choice seats) — right in the middle of the action at NDSM Wharf, Amsterdam.



Family discount: Family members can buy tickets for Section G at **50% discount** via

3x3festival.nl/community.



Max. **2 discounted tickets** per finalist.

BAD WEATHER SCENARIO

Rain doesn't stop the street — but we have a plan. The local SL captain always makes the decision on whether to continue playing, postpone, or move indoors. Make sure there is always a backup plan and that communication to teams is direct and clear. No confusion, no chaos — just clear leadership when it matters most.

→ Play


In light rain and safe conditions, play continues as normal. Players should be prepared for this.

→ Postpone

In heavy rain or unsafe situations, a stop can be temporarily postponed. Communicate the new time directly to all teams.

→ Move indoors

If a hall is available, the stop is moved indoors. The local captain arranges this in advance as an emergency measure.

 **Golden rule:** The local SL captain makes the decision. Communication to all participating teams must be fast, clear, and proactive in every situation. No teams should be caught off guard!

Use the Leader Hub to share the communication on the player platform and post it in the WhatsApp communities so everyone quickly knows the news and your decision!

MARCOM & CONTENT

Good content builds the community. Every event is a chance to make Street League visible, attract new players, and capture the energy of the street on camera. Leaders are also content creators — grab that phone and capture every winner, every dunk, every moment that matters. Coordination with the Marcom team (Shuwendly) is required.

Promotion

Flyers and posters with a QR code to the Player Hub. Distribute these in your city, at schools, gyms, and courts.

All teams must register on the Player Hub to track their points and ranking — this is also a marketing tool.



Content Guidelines

Take photos and videos for the local community pages. Focus on:

- Team photos before and after games
- Game highlights
- Photos of winners (with trophy/medal)
- Event atmosphere shots
- Behind the scenes with Leaders and Local Captain

Always use the official 3X3 Unites hashtags and tag the official accounts. Each city has its own community page — feed that page consistently with content after every stop. Consistency in content builds reach, and reach builds participation.

EXTRA — PRIVACY ON CAMERA

-   **Don't want to be in any photos or videos?** Pick up a red ribbon at the event. This makes you instantly visible to the content team as someone who does not wish to be photographed or filmed. We respect everyone's privacy — no questions asked.

RULES OVERVIEW — THE 12 COMMANDMENTS OF THE STREET LEAGUE

All participants must know these rules before the competition begins. Leaders ensure these rules are actively communicated at every stop — both verbally during the briefing and digitally via the Player Hub. Fair Play is not optional, it is the foundation of everything.

01

TEAM COMPOSITION

Assemble a team (maximum 6 players) and become captain, or join a team via an invitation.

02

ONE TEAM PER PLAYER

Each player may only play for one team throughout the entire competition.

03

MAX 4 PLAYERS PER GAME DAY

Per game day, a maximum of 4 players per team may be active. The captain decides the lineup.

04

CONFIRM ATTENDANCE

The captain confirms attendance no later than 1 hour before each game day. Not confirmed = risk of no-show.

05

FIBA 3X3 RULES

Play according to the official FIBA 3x3 rules. Know them, follow them.

06

CALL YOUR OWN FOULS

Matches are played without a referee. Players call their own fouls. Play fairly.

07

RESPECT (RULE 7)

Respect your opponents, the organization, and the playing field. Unsportsmanlike behavior can lead to disqualification.

08

POINTS PER GAME DAY

1st = 100 pts, 2nd = 80 pts, 3rd = 70 pts, and so on. Win every stop for maximum points.

09

FINAL RANKING

Determined based on the total points earned over 3 game days. All stops count.

10

QUALIFICATION

Per category and per district, one team qualifies for the 3x3 Festival Finals in Amsterdam.

11

FIBA ACCOUNT REQUIRED

All finalists must have a FIBA 3x3 account via play.fiba3x3.com before June 16.

12

BE PRESENT (RULE 12)

Be present 15 minutes before the start. Finals: 45 minutes in advance + ID required.



IMPORTANT CONTACTS

Know who to reach and when. Street League 2026 runs on a tight team — everyone has a clear role. If in doubt or you have questions: contact the right person directly. No detours, no delays.
